Who's Lobbying Who in BC?

Monthly Snapshot – February 28, 2018

The following organizations and consultant lobbyists submitted their registrations under the B.C. Lobbyists Registration Act and they were activated between February 1 and February 28, 2018. Here is a brief summary of lobbying activities organizations and consultant lobbyists have or expect to carry out. - 42. ARC Resources Ltd. is lobbying a number of public office holders on a range of issues including classification and treatment of oil wells, proposed gas processing regulation, upcoming changes to the BC Liability Management System, and LNG competitiveness.
- 43. The BC Care Providers Association is lobbying several ministers to advocate for the non-government senior's care sector in BC in residential care, assisted living, home care and home support, and to ensure adequate funding for the non-governmental seniors' care sector in BC.
- 44. The BC Chamber of Commerce is lobbying a number of public office holders on an extensive list of issues including: extend investment of at least \$2M per year in the BC Buy Local Program in 2020; target child care investment for facilities and spaces in those areas experiencing greater space deficits; ensure a sustainable, systematic approach to mental heat and addictions prevention and treatment.

- 45. The BC Non Profit Housing Association is lobbying the Premier and several Ministers regarding the establishment of more affordable rental housing in BC and Canada, support for low-income tenants, and the alleviation of homelessness through housing and support.
- 46. The British Columbia Wine Institute is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding continued support of key Provincial policies, including Direct-to-Consumer Delivery, BC Wine and Culinary Tourism, and BC Wine Authority recommended legislated changes.
- 47. Brookfield Energy Marketing Inc. is lobbying several public office holders to seek the issuance of permits or other approvals for new and existing energy projects, to encourage the awarding of Energy Purchase Agreements, and to encourage the development of energy policy that facilitates development and expansion of opportunities for independent power producers.
- 48. The Canadian Energy Pipeline Association is lobbying several public office holders on a range of issues including the Northwest Community Readiness Initiative, energy pipeline development, and the LNG greenhouse gas emissions framework.
- 49. The Canadian Fuels Association is lobbying several ministers on renewable fuels and low carbon fuels requirements regulations, contaminated sites standards and policies, fuel tax regulations, and the Transportation of Dangerous Goods policy directive.
- 50. The Canadian Home Builders' Association of BC is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding market housing affordability, skilled trades shortages and to introduce new incentives for energy-efficient retrofits.
- 51. Canfor Corporation is lobbying several public office holders on a range of issues including the softwood lumber dispute, offshore market development for forest products and bioenergy possibilities for BC.
- 52. The Commercial Bear Viewing Association is lobbying a number of public office holders to advance and continue the bear viewing industry.
- 53. The David Suzuki Foundation is lobbying a number of public office holders on a wide range of issues including BC's Carbon Tax, Site C, methane emissions, and BC Endangered Species Act.
- 54. The Downtown Vancouver Business Improvement Association is lobbying the Minister of Attorney General (and his staff) and the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing (and her staff) to effect changes to the Vancouver Charter regarding the Business Improvement Area renewal process and to discuss issues around property crime offenders.
- 55. Encana Corporation is lobbying an extensive list of public office holders on a range of topics including policies and programs to support a competitive and practical regulatory framework for resource

- development, carbon and greenhouse gas emissions policies, and assessment and taxation of industrial properties.
- 56. The Federation of Independent School Associations in British Columbia is lobbying the Minister of Education (and his staff) and staff of MLA Rob Fleming regarding regulations and policies affecting independent schools and to collaborate in supporting the new BC curriculum.
- 57. First Call: BC Child and Youth Advocacy Coalition is lobbying a number of public office holders on several issues including developing quality, affordable, accessible child care, improving protections for children and youth in the workforce and reducing and eliminating child, youth and family poverty.
- 58. FortisBC Energy Inc. is lobbying a several public office holders on a number of topics including amendments to Greenhouse Gas Reductions (Clean Energy) Regulation and possible directions under the Utilities Commission Act or Clean Energy Act in respect of natural gas infrastructure, natural gas as a transportation fuel and other possible uses of natural gas.
- 59. FortisBC Inc. is lobbying staff of BC Hydro and Power Authority and staff of the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources regarding development of policies and programs relating to electric vehicle charging stations, and relating to BC Hydro's proposed acquisition of Teck's interest in Waneta Dam and related assets.
- 60. Geoscience BC is lobbying a number of public office holders to provide an overview of Geoscience BC's projects in an effort to encourage future funding for the organization.
- 61. GS1 is lobbying a number of public office holders to advance the role of standards and tractability for the purpose of patient safety and health system sustainability, to support consumer safety, supply chain effectiveness and competitiveness, and to improve Canadian business safety, effectiveness and competitiveness.
- 62. HeliCat Canada Association is lobbying a number of public office holders concerning occupational health and safety policies and programs, BC Parks, Wildlife and related policies and programs, and land management and adventure tourism policies and programs.
- 63. The Hospital Employees' Union is lobbying an extensive list of public office holders on a number of issues, including advocating for improved occupational health and safety outcomes for health care and community service workers, and promoting safe, stable and high quality residential care, assisted living and home care services through increased staffing levels, enforceable standards of care and employment security.

- 64. Innergex Renewable Energy Inc. is lobbying a number of public office holders to streamline and improve environmental approvals process and advance climate policy and to improve the policy environment for renewable energy and climate change mitigation.
- 65. Interfor Corporation is lobbying a number of public office holders to discuss policies related to the forest industry, such as global and U.S trade issues, land use planning, safety, environmental policies and First Nations partnerships.
- 66. Janssen Inc. is lobbying several MLAs to discuss issues related to existing and future policies that may affect Janssen's pharmaceutical products as well as clinical research activities/investments.
- 67. Languages Canada is lobbying staff of the Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training to review Private Training Institutions Branch regulations and effectiveness for private languages schools.
- 68. Merck Canada Inc. is lobbying several public office holders to explore partnership opportunities and to engage in product listing and agreements with government.
- 69. The Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada, BC and Yukon Division is lobbying the Minister of Health to advocate for improvements to home and community care for people living with multiple sclerosis.
- 70. Navigata Communications Limited is lobbying staff of the Ministry of Citizens' Services to renegotiate telecommunications services contracts.
- 71. Novartis Pharmaceuticals Canada Inc. is lobbying staff of the Ministry of Health and staff of the Provincial Health Services Authority to facilitate patient access to Novartis medicines through listings by Pharmacare and the BC Cancer Agency, to enter into product listings agreements, and to facilitate patient access to Novartis medicines within provincial health authorities.
- 72. SFU Community Corporation is lobbying Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure staff regarding support for building the Burnaby Mountain gondola project.
- 73. Teck Resources Limited is lobbying a number of public office holders on several issues including climate change policy, tax competitiveness, BC-US transboundary matters, energy competitiveness and relationship and capacity building.
- 74. West Fraser Timber Co. Ltd. is lobbying a number of public office holders on a range of issues including potential bioenergy and natural gas electricity sales agreements, timber sales and timber tenure reform and pricing formulae, and management of forest resources.
